Nakadai is coming to Yale to show two of his films and engage in discussions after the screenings.

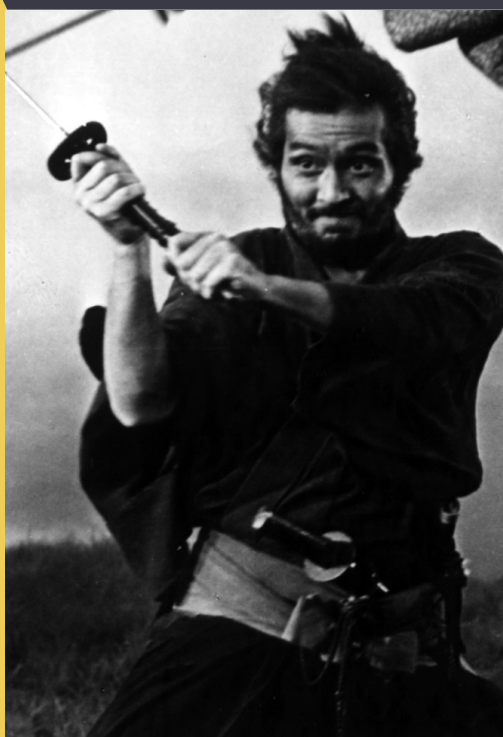

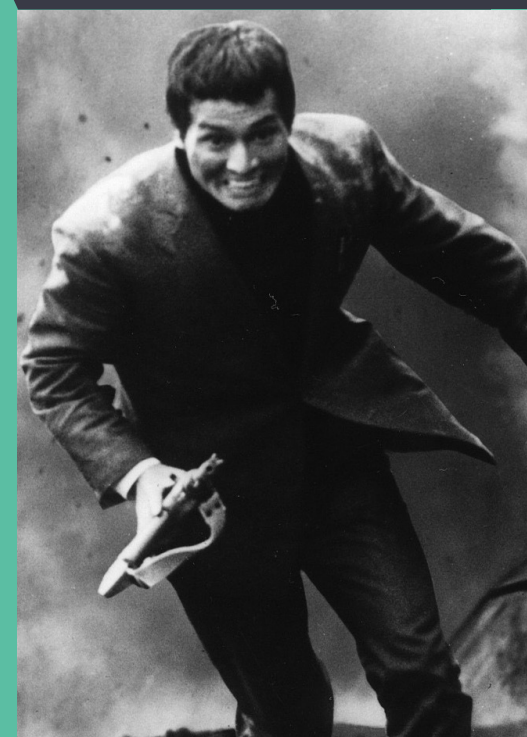
