New Haven, Conn. —Professor Sarah Nuttall will deliver a talk titled “The Redistributed University: Art, Politics, and Critique Here and Now” at the Whitney Humanities Center on Monday, March 26, 2018. The lecture will take place at 5 pm in Room 208 and is free and open to the public.

Nuttall is Professor of Literature and Cultural Studies and Director of WiSER (Wits Institute for Social and Economic Research) in Johannesburg, South Africa. She is the author of *Entanglement: Literary and Cultural Reflections on Postapartheid*, editor of *Beautiful/Ugly: African and Diaspora Aesthetics*, and coeditor of many books, including *Johannesburg: The Elusive Metropolis* and *Loadshedding: Writing On and Over the Edge of South Africa*. For five years she has directed WiSER, the largest and most established humanities institute across the Global South. In 2016 she was an Oppenheimer Fellow at the DuBois Institute at Harvard University.
